Our shrink film set contains a total of 10 A4 sheets (5 white and 5 transparent frosted sheets), which are suitable for printing with an inkjet printer and for painting. The bows are enough for a whole collection of different pieces of jewelry

#### PRINTING

The shrink wrap has a rough side and a smooth side.

Print the rough side of the film with your desired motifs using an inkjet printer.

Attention: Only use inkjet printers!

No laser printer, as it gets hot when printing and could melt the film. You can find suitable motifs at www.bines-shop.com (under "Shrink Wraps" you will find specially compiled coloring motifs that are ideally adapted to the format). Or paint and print your film in color or black and white with any other motif you like.



## **COLORING**

You will achieve ideal results if you color the motifs with colored pencils.

### CUT OUT

Cut out the motifs along the contour.

# **PUNCHING**

If you're making a pendant, don't forget to punch holes in the design before shrinking. Punch a sufficiently large hole with a hole punch or punch pliers, because the hole will also shrink!







Using a cake peel (or similar), you can completely flatten the warm, soft motif on the baking tray before it cools down and hardens in the next few seconds.

The painted, shrunken motifs have a very beautiful, matt surface. If you want, you can still seal the shrunken motifs.

For the elephants I used a special epoxy resin, especially for jewelry. This makes the surfaces look mirror-smooth and glazed.

## **MAKE JEWELRY**

Add a ribbon to the pendants or glue them to ring blanks or ear clips with jewelry glue.
